Festival Queen in 1963, our Diamond Jubilee Queen this year is Christine Billing (now Masini), who had already featured in the Court as a Trainbearer in 1957.

Christine was the only daughter of Mr & Mrs Len Billing, who lived at Birch House in the High Street, where they had a small tearoom and operated a couple of looms in the former bake house at the back of the house. She completed her schooling at Eastwood High School after the family moved to Glasgow, before going on to the Royal Scottish Academy of Music in Glasgow, where she gained her diploma in Musical Education, then did a further year to specialise in piano accompaniment, followed by teacher training a Jordanhill.

She taught music in St Columba's High School in Gourock before moving to Italy, where she married sculptor Maurizio Masini in 1975. They now have a son, a daughter and two grandsons. Christine continued to teach music in secondary schools in Italy until 2011 and, in 2012, became one of the stable accompanists at the flute master classes taken by Sir James and Lady Jeanne Galway in Milan and Weggis, Switzerland.

In the last year Christine has become the harpsichordist in a string ensemble, performing Baroque music by Vivaldi, Corelli and various other composers, and so she is, unfortunately, unable to join us for Festival Week, as she has a busy agenda of concerts right through the summer season in San Gimignano.

Festival Queen in 1973, our Golden Jubilee Queen this year is Jennifer Herd.

Born in Edinburgh, Jenny moved to Melrose Grammar School from near Morpeth during Primary 6. At the time of her crowning, she lived at Lowood Mains, where her dad was the farm manager for Mrs Hamilton of Lowood Estate.

After leaving Melrose Grammar, she went to Gala Academy but a change of job for her Dad took them, in May 1974, to the Isle of Islay, where her parents stayed until the early 1980s, when they moved to the Isle of Bute. In the meantime, Jenny had spent a gap year in London, before going to University in Glasgow in 1980, from where she graduated with an honours degree in Philosophy and then did a teaching diploma.

She worked as a vegetarian cook in Edinburgh for a couple of years and then moved to the Lake District in 1988. After working as a cook for a further 2 years, she held an admin post with the then Nature Conservancy Council for 4 years, then moved on to charity development work, got married and had two sons, one of whom is profoundly physically disabled with cerebral palsy. She is no longer in paid employment, but is involved in a number of committees and campaigns regarding disability and communication. She enjoys cooking, baking and going to the Alps and Italy when time, money and support for her disabled son allow!

Hannah Syme • Festival Queen 1998

Our Silver Jubilee Queen this year is Hannah Syme, daughter of Paul and Sarah Syme of Gattonside and elder sister of William.

Hannah was crowned in the Abbey on a misty June evening in 1998 and, at the end of the Tour of Ceremonies on the Saturday, she felt lucky to be the first Queen to lay a wreath over Robert the Bruce's heart, which had been reburied in the Abbey earlier that year. The Tour also gave her the opportunity to meet both the Laird of Abbotsford, Mrs Patricia Maxwell-Scott, and her sister, Dame Jean, who were responsible for first opening up Abbotsford House to the public and were Sir Walter Scott's last direct descendants to live there Later in 1998, she was honoured to return to plant a sapling in Abbotsford's grounds in Mrs Patricia's memory. This has grown into a big oak tree these 25 years later.

After her stint as Queen, Hannah went on to be Head Girl at Earlston High School, before studying medicine at the University of Oxford. She has travelled extensively, including a short stint working in remote parts of the South Pacific with the Red Cross. She settled in Edinburgh where she works as an NHS GP partner, teaches at Edinburgh University Medical School and volunteers as medical support for the Borders Book Festival. In her spare time she still enjoys learning about history and exploring Scotland through long-distance trail and Munro hiking, skiing and wild swimming.



Our Golden Jubilee Melrosian this year is Roy Mack. Roy was the only child of Alex and Ella Mack of Newstead and much of his boyhood was spent on various farms around Melrose, following his father's employment.

He attended Melrose Grammar School and Galashiels Academy and was a member of the Melrose Company of the Lifeboys and of the Boys' Brigade. He was keen on sport, particularly rugby,

playing for a time in a very good Melrose Colts side.

After school, Roy followed his mother's footsteps in PE, attending Jordanhill College, where he earned a DipPhysEd and, in 1972, he embarked on what became a 42 year career at George Watson's College in Edinburgh, starting as a Physical Education teacher, then Boarding House Master, APT Guidance, Principal Teacher of PE and, finally, Director of Projects for the school at the time of his retirement in 2014.

In 1975, having announced their engagement at the Festival Ball in his Melrosian year, he married Florence Purves, whom he had met at school, and they have a daughter, Morven, a son, Stuart, and four grandchildren, Jack, Abbi, Alfie and Ruby. Home is in Swanston, Edinburgh, but they also retain the former family home in Newstead, where they enjoy frequent breaks.

Sport was always important to Roy, particularly rugby, and over the years he coached his school's top teams, as well as the Scottish U15 and U16 teams and the Currie and Watsonians senior sides.

He has always been a faithful supporter of our Festival, returning regularly for Festival events, and he served for a time as Secretary of the Ex-Melrosians' Association.

Since retirement, Roy has become a Murrayfield stadium guide, is a Trustee of the Watsonian Benevolent Fund and also a Former President of the Watsonian Club. He enjoys spending time with his family, fishing and playing golf.

In 2015, Roy and Florence were Principal Guests for Festival Week, when Roy delivered an outstanding oration in the Abbey and Florence crowned the Festival Queen, Robyn Mackay.

Monday - Rideout Safety

- All riders must be in good state of health, capable and wearing appropriate safety clothing and protective headgear.
- It is the responsibility of the riders to ensure they have appropriate insurance cover.
- Please note that spot checks will be carried out at the rideout to ascertain that this is the case.
- All riders must follow the instructions given by the Marshals, who are identified by high visibility clothing.
- All riders under secondary school age or novice riders must be accompanied by an experienced adult rider who will take responsibility for them during the rideout.
- Prior to the commencement of the rideout, official ribbons will be passed to all
 riders who assemble at the triangle and meet the above requirements. Please note
 that only those riders wearing the ribbons will be deemed to be taking part in the
 Melrose Festival Rideout.
- All headgear must comply with current British Safety Standards.

Tuesday - Fancy Dress Safety

- All participants must follow the instructions given by marshalls, who are identified by hi-visibility clothing
- All children, especially those on floats, must be supervised at all times.
- All floats must have edge protection and a safe means of getting on and off.
 The Melrose Festival will inspect all floats prior to the parade.
- When travelling on floats, all children must remain seated at all times.
- All ponies must be led by experienced handlers.

Wednesday - Bike Ride Safety

- Cyclists must be at least Primary 1 school age and all cyclists attending Primary School P1-P5 must be supervised by cycling adults. Please note that younger children may participate if they are travelling with a responsible adult cyclist on a child's cycle seat or in a bicycle trainer.
- All cyclists and young children in cycle seats must wear appropriate clothing and safety helmets.
- Cyclists must remain between the front and rear Marshals' car and remain in the left hand carriage way, unless instructed to move by the Police or Marshals. Children of primary school age must cycle only on the inside of this lane at the kerbside.
- All cyclists must follow the instructions given by the Marshals, who are indentified by high visibility clothing.

TOUR OF CEREMONIES

Notes for Saturday's tour of Historic Sites



The Square

Saturday's tour of Melrose's historic places begins in the Square under the shadow of the Mercat Cross, at one time the hub of all community life and activity. Sadly none of the original Cross, the main part of which once stood at the main gate to the Abbey which was located at the top of the present-day Abbey Street, now remains on site. The Cross was moved to its present position in more recent times, and the finial was replaced with a unicorn holding a shield bearing the Royal Arms of Scotland in 1645. It is understood that the base of the Cross, although now much the oldest part, has been rebuilt several times, and the shaft (the last part of the original Cross) and the finial, due to the ravages of time and weather, were renewed in 1988 and 1990 respectively.

All too rarely now, the 'marriage ball' is kicked off from the Cross by newly-wed brides, the only remaining, albeit tenuous, link with the ancient Fastern's E'en Ba' game, held annually in the town until abolished by the Town Council in 1901.

Before the days of tarmacadam, the Square was unsurfaced, providing a natural venue for the annual sheep market, which was reputedly a lively and prosperous event. The drove roads brought flocks into Melrose from all directions and the event doubtless provided many a culprit to stand in the jougs, which were held by the staple still to be seen in the shaft of the Cross.

Newstead and Trimontium

Newstead was built to accommodate the camp followers of the Roman legions, and since those days, has been inhabited without a break. When King David built the first Abbey of Melrose, his stone masons stayed there and from them several families in Melrose trace their descent. On the spot where these masons founded the Masonic Lodge of Melrose, claimed to be the oldest in the land, Office-Bearers of the Lodge greet the Melrosian and assure us that the industry and craftsmanship which built the Abbey still flourishes today.

Trimontium, a strategic site commanding the river crossing of Dere Street, was important enough to figure in Ptolemy's Geography. First established to house Agricola's troops, both foot and horse, in 80 A.D., it was periodically rebuilt and reoccupied until about 200 A.D. At the stone erected by the Edinburgh Borderers Association to mark the camp site, the Melrosian and party are greeted by a figure garbed as a Roman soldier and he, in well chosen words and resounding tones, links distant Rome and present Melrose.

After the Romans came the Cross. From the way down to Leaderfoot with its three bridges, we can see beyond the A68 the wooded headland of Old Melrose, where the names of Chapelknowe, Holywell and Monksford tell us that here was the first monastic settlement, founded in 653 by St. Aidan.

Gattonside

House names of The Orchard, Orchard Neuk and Orchard Cottage are a link with the days when the lay brothers of Melrose cultivated here their south facing orchards. A pleasant ceremony is enacted at the village green when a resident of modern Gattonside in monks' garb invites the Melrosian to partake of cherries, the fruit of the orchard.

Boston House is a reminder of a family for 600 years resident in the village. Its reputed founder Bastoun, a French harpist with Edward's army at Bannockburn to sing the greatness of the expected English victory, found himself a prisoner with the Scots. So well did his celebration of Scotland's triumph please Bruce, that he was rewarded with lands in Gattonside.

Abbotsford

The next point in the morning's pilgrimage is Abbotsford. The warm, personal relationship which Sir Walter Scott established with Melrose and its townsfolk has been continued since then, and each year the citizens pay tribute to the fact that to him, to his first great poem and to his successful efforts to save the Abbey from collapse, Melrose owes the worldwide interest it enjoys.

Darnick Tower

Darnick Peel Tower, guarded by two stalwart Men-at-Arms, is the second last ceremonial call for the Melrosian. It is one of the most perfectly preserved specimens of Peel Towers in the Borders, built and until very recently, owned by the Heitons and still used as a residence today. It was built in 1425 by the Heiton family and owned by them until 2017. Partially destroyed by Hereford in 1545, it was rebuilt in 1569, although it appears to have been sufficiently habitable to provide Mary Queen of Scots with a night's lodgings on her way to Jedburgh in 1566 according to one tradition. Round Darnick Tower the last clan battle of the Borders took place in 1526 between the followers of Angus and Buccleuch, and it is said that James V watched the progress of the fight from the battlements of the tower. Close to the tower were two others of one there is now no trace and of the other, three of the original outer walls remain. After a welcome from the new owner, Mrs Julie Chapman-Purchas, the Melrosian will receive honey from the roses of the garden and to the Lord Abbot, soon to play a role at the Abbey, is offered a gift of wax 'to lighten your convent at Melrose".

Melrose Abbey

The final ceremony of the morning takes place at the Abbey, where over 850 years of ecclesiastical history are recalled. The Abbey of St. Mary is the earliest Cistercian settlement in Scotland. Under Abbot Richard, a colony of monks from Rievaulx in Yorkshire began building and the church was dedicated in 1136, on a site chosen because of its fine water supply and drainage. The monks enjoyed extensive lands, the right of pasture, fishing and timber as far afield as Traquair.

Against this sermon in stone which is the Abbey, the last deeds of remembrance and thanksgiving take place. The Melrosian narrates the history and Abbot Richard and monks receive the founding charter from King David (1136).

"I, David First, King of Scots, confirm by this, my charter to you, the Abbot and Convent of Saint Mary, the endowment which I have been pleased to give to found my new church here, and by it I have given to you the lands of Little Fordel, Darnick, Gattonside, Newstead and Eildon, for the glory of God and as a perpetual possession to your order."

The later part in the Abbey's history, involving Robert Bruce, is then commemorated by the laying of flowers. Robert Bruce's heart was brought to the Abbey, and following reburial, it now resides in the cloister gardens.

The story of the Abbey will then be briefly brought up to date, before the ceremony is concluded by a short service of thanksgiving for the Festival Week.


